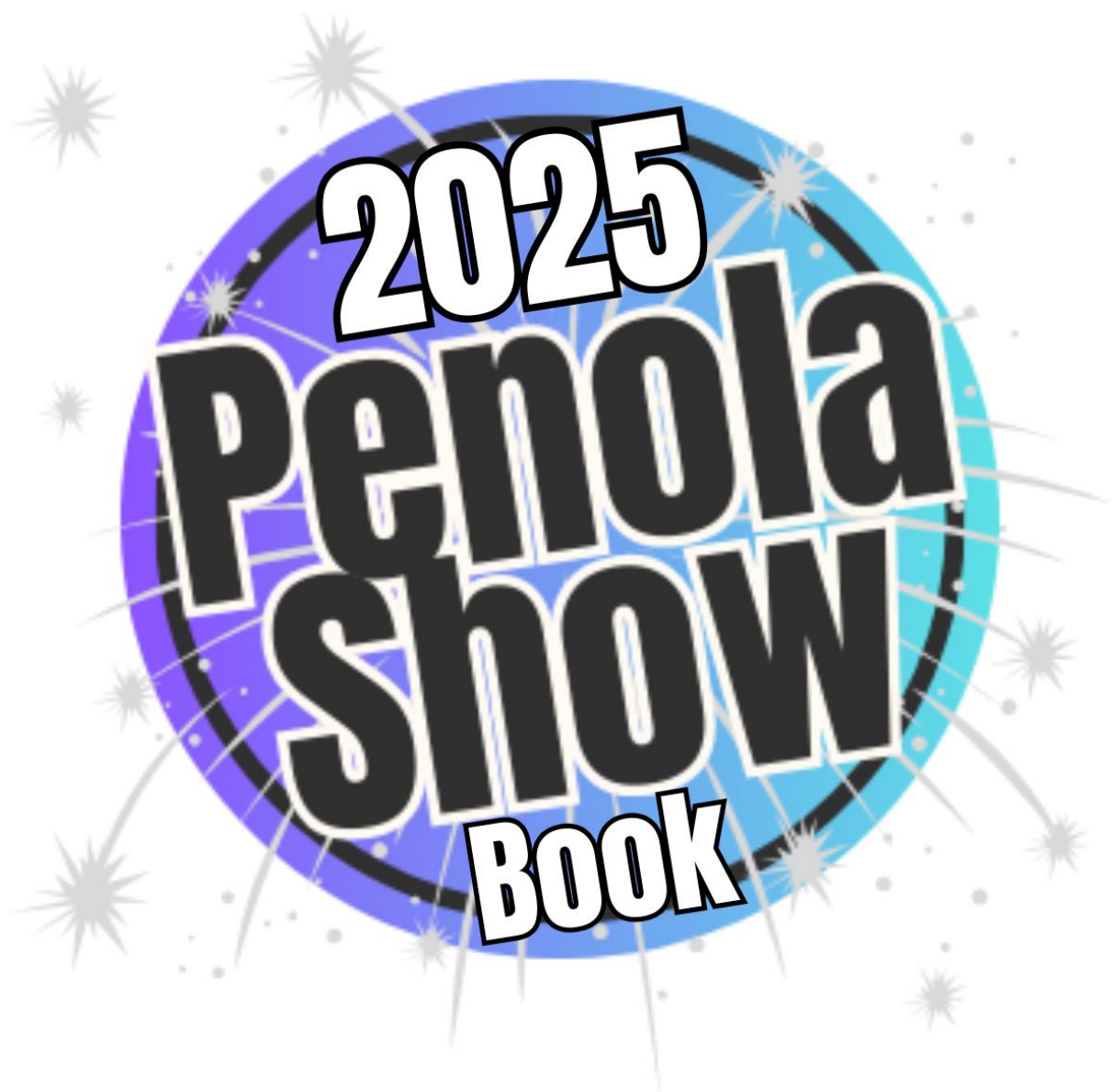

5. All entries must be staged by 11am unless otherwise specified.
6. In the event of a tie for any aggregate prize, the winner will be the exhibitor gaining the greatest number of first prizes.
7. In addition to points for first and second awards, one point will also be allocated for a Championship award.
8. Exhibits can be collected from 2pm onwards, Saturday from Rymill Hall and the Stadium. No exhibits to be removed before 2pm, unless specifically authorised.
9. Late exhibitors may be disqualified following the declaration of the Hall Steward, that the exhibiting period has expired.
10. Following the expiration of the exhibiting period, all people other than judges and stewards must leave the hall.
11. NO LATE ENTRIES ACCEPTED.
12. Prize money to be collected between 2pm -3pm Saturday 1st November from Show Office.
13. No exhibit will be permitted to compete in more than one class.
14. All exhibits must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.

Sift flour, place all dry ingredients in basin, mix. Add melted butter, golden syrup and boiling water to which the carb soda has been added. Place teaspoon of mixture on tray bake until brown.
